BSU Welcomes Peace Corps Prep Program

For the first time ever Boise State University is partnered with the Peace Corps offering students the opportunity to participate in Peace Corps Prep. The Peace Corps website states, "Peace Corps Prep is a certificate program for undergraduates that centers on one empowering question: How can you prepare yourself to be the best Peace Corps Volunteer you can be?" The goal of the Peace Corps Prep program is to ensure that students graduate with the four core competencies Peace Corps considers critical for service. The competencies include sector-specific skills, foreign language proficiency, intercultural competence, and professional savvy and leadership. The Peace Corps Prep program directs students through requirements that assist them with the acquisition of these four core competencies. The requirements include completion of applicable coursework and at least 50 hours of professional experience that relates to a student's desired sector of Peace Corps service. Faculty from various disciplines serve as sector advisors, many of whom are RPCVs. The sector advisors assist the Peace Corps Prep students in tailoring the program requirements to fit students' interest, passion, and desired region of service.

Unique aspects of the Boise State Peace Corps Prep program include the requirement to attend Boise State's annual Tunnel of Oppression. The Tunnel of Oppression is a 20-30 minute interactive theater that challenges the way people think about marginalized groups. Additionally, students will strongly be encouraged to participate in courses with a service-learning aspect, allowing them to bridge classroom learning with applied experiences within the community. Boise State University hopes to recruit 8-10 Peace Corps Prep students a year and increase the awareness on campus of the opportunity to serve in the Peace Corps. Opportunities for Idaho RPCVs to support the Prep program will be advertised as events and recruiting sessions are developed.
