WASHINGTON – In celebration of the Peace Corps' 57th anniversary on March 1, the agency kicks off Peace Corps Week to commemorate the contributions of volunteers and their communities worldwide. Throughout the week, the Peace Corps community will participate in events that underscore this year's theme, "Highlighting Home."



"Peace Corps volunteers develop enduring connections with the people and places where they serve," said Acting Peace Corps Director Sheila Crowley. "Communities around the globe welcome volunteers into their hearts and homes. This year, Peace Corps Week is about sharing these lifechanging experiences and honoring the communities volunteers call home

during their service."

The Peace Corps will also participate in a special event on February 28 hosted by the African Union honoring America's connection to global diaspora communities. The event will feature Peace Corps, the Department of State, U.S. Agency for Interna-

tional Development and International diaspora Engagement Alliance (IdEA).



Remembering Pat Hughes Thailand 1971-1974

Patricia Rose (Pat) Hughes - born March 26, 1947 in Salina, Kansas, died December 21, 2017 in Boise after battling esophageal cancer for more than a year.

Pat served in the Peace Corps for 3 years - from 1971 to 1974 in Kanchanaburi, Thailand at Thamaka School where she taught English. She stayed for the extra year so she could finish with her students. She lived with a family for her first year there, but then shared a house on the school grounds with another teacher. Pat went back to visit in the mid 80s



and then again in 2007 and 2012, each time welcomed with open arms by her former students and teachers. Her Peace Corps service undoubtedly defined the rest of her life.

Pat was active in the Idaho Returned Peace Corps Volunteers, serving on the board, helping to build the "Peace Corps Taxi" that is used in parades, serving on the board of IRPCV and also serving on the board for Friends of Thailand. Her other passion was Common Ground Community Chorus of which she was a member from its beginning in 2000, often serving on the board. The choir's focus is diversity and human rights.

When Pat passed, the President of Friends of Thailand (FoT) posted: Pat left us in the early hours of December 21, 2017. She was a good friend to so many of us; an active member of her RPCV group in Idaho, a singer and organizer for Common Ground Community Chorus in Boise, and a long-term Friend of Thailand, who served on the original FoT Advisory Board, and later on the FoT Board of Directors. Some of you even heard from her when your FoT membership had lapsed. Oh, Pat. You were the epitome of the saying, "Once a volunteer, always a volunteer."

Fond memories also came from Pat's former Thai students: The good relationship between her



as my teacher and me as one of her Thai students will never be ended. Our hearts know. RIP. my dearest teacher."

And this from one of the choir members: She was one of the first people who welcomed me into Common Ground. Rainbows need both rain and light to form. Pat is definitely the light, and our sorrow, the rain. There's a beautiful rainbow shining tonight.

Pat will be sincerely missed but her legacy lives on through her good work, fond memories and her dedicated wife, Trish McKernan.

Update on Bou, Aviva's Host Brother

It was such an honor to have my brother, Bou, chosen by IRPCV for a grant this past

spring. That grant allowed him to attend job training in Genova, Italy for translators and facilitators of new refugees. Bou had the opportunity to be the only refugee in that position! All of his colleagues were Italians. It was such an amazing experience. He truly loved the job and felt like he was really helping people struggling in a new country, just like him.

While he worked this job for several months and seemed to excel at it, it all fell apart when he was attacked by a fellow

refugee in his camp, jealous of all of the things Bou had. Bou moved out of the refugee camp and quit his job and went to live with friends in a town nearby. He found a contract job soon after, but about 3 months ago they declined to sign him on again. Unable to find a job in Sanova, he moved to Milan on January 31. Here he is hoping to find greater opportunities since it's a larger city with more tourists. Have I mentioned that Bou speaks seven languages including Italian, French and English? After living on the street for 2 nights, he found his way into a new refugee camp and he is starting anew. The struggle continues, but he is stronger for all of the opportunities he's been afforded. He is eternally grateful to the IRPCV for the support and vote of confidence they have given him by sending him to train for a job he hopes to hold again in the future.

On an encouraging note, he has an assigned lawyer that has helped him present his case for asylum at an immigration court in Genova. He has already had his first round of interviews, conducted all in Italian, and is looking forward to being called in

again. This may come as soon as April.

I want to add in my personal thanks to everyone in IRPCV for listening to Bou's story and for supporting him. This man is incredibly important to my husband and I, and while supporting him financially isn't always easy, we wouldn't have it any other way. Thank you for helping us support him and give him as many opportunities as we can from afar.

Please note: Adults will be able to electronically sign the release online. Minors will be prompted to print it and will need to have their legal guardian sign it and bring it in when they volunteer.



We are all desperately interested in helping our local refugee population set up new lives and find a place in their new home in Idahome. After spending some time brainstorming with the Volunteer Coordinator, Julie Bayard, at the ANA, a new opportunity has been created and we would love to hear back from you! The program is new and has yet to be named, so for now, let's call it the ANA Community Engagement Program. The premise of the program is to help refugees who have recently arrived in the Boise-area become comfortable in the places they know AND help them break through boundaries into the community. Let's help them become more comfortable

within their new home and explore the area, and become familiar participating in new activities! We will do this in partnership with the ANA and the families they serve. The ANA gets calls all the time from different organizations and groups offering tickets to a play or opera, time at the local skating rink, help navigating local hiking trails, etc. What the ANA needs from us are people willing to spend time around town with these interested refugees and rides to and from the activity. We think we can provide this support!
