He's one of the newest faces at Lewis-Clark State College, and Assistant Professor of Education, Bryce Smedley, is bringing the charm of the LC Valley to the world, and at the same time, the cultures of the world, right back here to the LC Valley. then parts of Africa," said Smedley. He began his path to traveling the world after he studied anthropology in college, and then joined the Peace Corps. So I think serving in Kenya with the United States Peace Corps opened my eyes to working with I. Africans in language and health literacy, and HIV education," I. said Smedley. Volunteers helped prepare food items for the Backpack Program. Jennifer Rogers worked with the Idaho Foodbank Volunteer Services Team this year to help organize IRPCV efforts. Helping with the Backpack Program proved to be a truly rewarding experience, as participants have donated at least one evening during the months of March, April, May, June, July, August, September and October to help with this endeavor. In its vision of a hunger-free Idaho, the mission of the Idaho Foodbank is to help feed, educate and advocate for Idaho's hungry through a network of community-based partners and to develop efficient solutions to strengthen individuals, families and communities. In 2015, more than 20,000 volunteers dedicated approximately 62,000 hours to helping the Idaho Foodbank provide emergency food assistance. About ANA: ANA's mission is to help refugees achieve self-sufficiency in their new lives by providing the skills, education, and support necessary during their resettlement period.

What we will do to help ANA: We will help the supply coordinator organize and box donated items for distribution amongst refugee families. Then we will help deliver packages to 1-2 families each! Each individual can decide whether they want to stay and have a conversation with the family, or just drop off and run, based on their individual comfort level.

When: This activity is set to occur every 3 months. Next proposed dates are still to come, so stay tuned and look out for e-mails and Facebook posts!

IRPCV Volunteer at the Learning Lab

About Learning Lab: The Learning Lab's mission is to teach and encourage adults who struggle with literacy, and to encourage families to discover the joy of learning. It is a computer-assisted learning center for adults and families with children ages 6 and under. Students in this program receive basic skills instruction including mathematics, reading, writing, spelling, GED preparation and workplace skills. IRPCV is lucky enough to have been invited to work with their student population through one of our co-president's classes!

Where we come in: The aim is to come volunteer at each of Lila's classes about once a month. We will start with resume help (though it may be more of a conversation about what they can include on a resume), and build from there. We may eventually do a how-to-use-google maps tutorial. All work at the Learning Lab is one-on-one.

Where we will work: The people we will be helping are refugees and those living in the US who are trying to better their lives. The first student group that we will work with are mostly refugees (class located at the Boise Library) and the second student group we will work with is mostly Latino (class located in a Garden City facility).

Get in touch if you're interested: We will cap the number of volunteers going at 14, so it'll be first come, first serve. Aviva will need to know who's interested by the week before each event, so she can let Lila plan for our arrival.
